

Enrollment Information

“Summer in the Meadow” programs are one-week long. You may enroll for one week, all weeks, or any combination. To register, complete and submit the registration form **at least one week prior to start date of the camp**. When enrolling more than one child, please submit a separate form for each child. You may pay in person or register online on the Meadow Montessori School web site.

Please be sure that the course(s) you select matches the grade, your child’s age, or the classroom they’ve attended for the 2017-18 school year. Which program they attend depends on a few factors. If you’re unsure what program you should register for, please contact the school at 734-241-9496. Waitlists

Many classes fill quickly. We recommend you register as early as possible. Waitlists will be kept in the event a class fills. You will be notified if a space becomes available.

Refunds, Withdrawals, & Transfers

To guarantee your child’s enrollment in a class, full payment must be received **at least one week prior to the first day of class**. Enrollment fees may not be returned should your child be withdrawn from a class. A withdrawal is defined as dropping a class without replacing it with another. A transfer is defined as dropping one class and replacing it with another. Transfer fees may be assessed at the discretion of the Director of Finance.

Daily Needs (Lunch, Water, Sunscreen)

This year, the Monroe Family YMCA will provide a FREE healthy lunch to students through the SFSP (Summer Food Service Program). Students are also welcome to bring their own healthy lunch, should they wish.

Hydration is important in the summer, so we ask that you please provide your child(ren) with a filled water bottle each day at camp. We will provide milk and water for those staying for lunch

and students can always refill their bottles from our drinking fountain.

Please also apply sunscreen to your child before they arrive at camp. We take every precaution to keep your child(ren) from getting too much sun, and if you would like your child to have sunscreen reapplied throughout the day, please send in the sunscreen with their name labeled on the container. Be sure you let the staff know that your child has sunscreen and needs to reapply.

Payment of Class Costs and Fees

All fees are due in full one week prior to the first day of the camp your student will be attending. Please note, many camps have a small supply fee which is paid directly to the teacher. **All supply fees are due on the first day of camp.**

Emergency Forms

All children, including Meadow Montessori students, are required to submit basic emergency forms. This is not required if you have a current form on file (please check with Ms. Tiffany in the office to see that you are up-to-date). These forms must be submitted prior to the Camp and are due by the first day of class. For our student’s safety, your child will not participate in a class without this information.

Allergies, Food Allergies, & Sensitivities

Meadow Montessori School must be notified if your child has an allergy, food allergy, or food sensitivity prior to the enrollment and the student’s start date. Please provide the school with all necessary documentation, emergency information, and necessary medications. Please be advised that some classes provide snack or work with food. All staff members are trained in anaphylaxis emergencies. We have two Epinephrine injection pens on the school grounds and take every precaution possible to avoid any food allergy emergency. If your child has a known allergy, we require a completed FARE’s “Food Allergy & Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan” which must be signed by you and your child’s physician. Cancellations and Changes

If we do not meet the minimum number of students, the summer camp will be canceled, and you will be notified of the cancellation. While we do everything in our power to keep all camps as published in this catalog, camps are subject to change without notice.

Arrivals and Departures

Students must be signed IN when they arrive and OUT when they leave daily by a parent/guardian or other person responsible for child's care. Rosters for signing in/out are kept on clipboards in the Commons (located in the ETC room in the Elementary Building and in hallway for Early Childhood Building). It is recommended that students arrive 10 to 15 minutes early on the first day of each week to leave time for signing in and locating classes.

Infant Summer Childcare - 6 weeks through 18 months

Key Concepts & Practices

- The aim of the Montessori infant program is to foster the development of basic trust and to assist in the normal development of the personality.
- Basic trust develops in an environment where people respond appropriately to the infant's communication of needs to be loved, respected, and accepted.
- Infants learn through their senses. They learn by watching and moving freely. Freedom to move is essential to the development of the infant's potential
- The infant is considered as a whole person and is affected by the quality of holding and feeding, as well as the quality of physical care.
- Learning, which leads to independence, occurs when infants participate in their daily routines of care.

Toddler Summer

Toddler Summer Childcare - 18 months through 3 years

Key Concepts & Practices

Our Toddler House is designed to assist toddlers with being able to take their first steps outside of their home. This is a place where children first begin to interact with people beyond the family. The toddlers most important work, and the emphasis in Toddler House, is the acquisition of language, along with the development and refinement of gross motor coordination. The Toddler House provides a nurturing, safe, and happy environment for this growth to take place.

Toddlers will receive a free, nutritious lunch daily through the Monroe Family YMCA's SFSP. They are also welcome to bring their own healthy lunch and drink, if you prefer.

Children's House in the Summer

Preschool - Kindergarten (Ages 3 -6)

Key Concepts & Practices

Children's House is designed for young children 3 to 6 years of age. Children will develop social skills in the classroom, learn to work in groups, and gain independence. Student's will work at their own pace, while focusing on peer-to-peer social skills and also lessons.

In this classroom, students are taught practical life skills from three categories: care-of-the-self, care-of-the-environment, and physical skills. These skills include hand washing, snack preparation, cleaning the classroom, and pounding, scooping, pouring, and lacing activities. Students have a great deal of freedom in terms of following their own academic interests. With the guidance of their teachers, students may select appropriate learning activities.

Students use traditional Montessori materials, such as number boards, counting beads, and fingerboards, to learn basic math facts. In science, students study plants and animals, learning basic classification skills, such as differentiating between organic/inorganic, plant/animal, and living/non-living.

Students will receive special lessons for the summer and will do theme-based activities throughout the summer. Outdoor time will again be a large part of the summer program in Children's House. Please see "Daily Needs" for water and sunscreen recommendations.

Ms. Dawn Weatherholt and Ms. Beth Patton will again be the primary teachers this summer.

Full-day students in the summer preschool program may pack a healthy lunch each day, or they may participate in the free Summer Food Service Program on-site, provided by the Monroe Family YMCA.

Please note: We will be closed July 2-5, 2018 in observance of Independence Day and August 27-31, 2018 for school-wide professional development. No summer camp or child care will be available.

Grades 1 – 6

- All camps are a full week long.
- AM camps run from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.
